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Executive Summary

E.1 Introduction

The Assam Gas Cracker Project is being implemented by M/s. Brahmaputra Cracker and Polymer Limited (BCPL), which is a joint venture company of GAIL, OIL, NRL and AIDC (Government of Assam). This integrated petrochemical project in Assam is expected to produce 220,000 tons of polyethylene, 60,000 tons of polypropylene, 55,000 tons of raw pyrolysis gasoline and 12,500 tons of fuel oil per year. The site selected for Assam Gas Cracker Project is at Lepetkata, 15 km from Dibrugarh town on NH-37 along river Sessa in Assam.

The total land earmarked for the project is around 1100 Acres and the land acquisition process has already been completed with the help of State government. A total of 66 families have been rehabilitated with compensation provided for crops, houses and infrastructure.

North Eastern Development Finance Corporation Ltd. (NEDFi), has engaged Mott MacDonald for undertaking the *Benchmark Study for Identifying the Baseline Data for Socio-economic Benefit Indicators for the Assam Gas Cracker Project*.

The main **Objectives** of the study are:

- To identify various socio-economic indicators and determine the baseline data for the same on the basis of in-situ investigations.
- To evolve a methodology for continuous evaluation and monitoring of the identified socio-economic indicators.

The overall **Approach** was multi-disciplinary and diagnostic, involving both primary and secondary sources wherever applicable. On the basis of the Terms of Reference and discussions held with the Client and our understanding, a broad category of benefit indicators and their sub-categories were listed and presented to NEDFi in the form of an Inception Report. These indicators have been broadly categorised into:

- Economic/Development Indicators
- Sector-Specific (Plastic) Indicators
- Infrastructure Indicators
- Social Indicators

These indicators have been further subcategorised into critical and desirable indicators for prioritisation of the assessment of impacts. During the course of the study, specifically after the primary and secondary data collection was completed, the team shortlisted, from these indicators, a select set of indicators under each of the above broad heads depending on impact of investments as well as data availability from published sources. Data available from published sources is required as in subsequent years, the data needs to be collected from these sources for continuous monitoring.

The baseline data have been collected mainly from published sources. The data have been collected both for Assam and the other North-Eastern states, and the PIA.

A monitoring framework for assessment and evaluation of the identified socio-economic indicators has been developed. The framework provides the baseline data, data source, year in which the data should be tracked as well as the impact whether positive or negative.

E.2 Baseline Indicators for Assam

From various parameters of development, *selective indicators* were shortlisted which will have a direct impact (either positive or negative), due to investment in the Assam Gas Cracker Project and its downstream plastic processing.

E.4 Socio-Economic Baseline Indicators for the Project Impact Area (PIA) Districts

The Assam Gas Cracker Project is being set up in and around the Dibrugarh district at Lepetkata, Duliajan and Lakwa. After discussions with NEDFi, the PIA (Project Impact Area) districts identified include Dibrugarh and the neighbouring districts of Tinsukia, Sibsagar & Jorhat in Assam, Changlang in Arunachal Pradesh and Mokokchung in Nagaland.

Dibrugarh District is located in the plains of the Upper Assam region and lies towards the North East region of the Brahmaputra Basin. The total area of the district is 3381 sq. km. With Headquarters in Dibrugarh, the District has 1345 villages, 7 blocks, 1 sub-division and 9 towns; including Dibrugarh, Chabua, Naharkatia, Duliajan, Digboi and Namrup. The project location (at Lepetkata) is about 15 km from Dibrugarh town.

Tinsukia District is located in Upper Assam, bounded by Arunachal Pradesh in the East & South, by Dibrugarh District in the South-West and the Dhemaji District, separated from Tinsukia District by the mighty river Brahmaputra, in the North. Tinsukia is also a major railhead of Assam and acts as a link to all other cities in the North East of India. The total geographical area of the Tinsukia District is 3790 sq. km. The District has 4 Revenue circles and 7 Development blocks. In addition, there are 88 Gram Panchayats and 1162 villages, of which 1138 are inhabited and rest 24 are uninhabited. There is one Zila Parishad and 3 sub-divisions. The project location (at Lepetkata) is about 55 km from Tinsukia town.

Sibsagar District is located in the Upper Assam Region, 370 km northeast of Guwahati, and is predominantly a plain land in the Brahmaputra Valley. The District shares common boundaries with Dibrugarh District in the east, Jorhat District in the west, river Brahmaputra in the North and the states of Nagaland and Arunachal Pradesh in the south. The total Area of the district is 2668 sq. km. The District consists of 873 villages, 9 blocks, 3 subdivisions and 5 towns including Sibsaagar (District Headquarter), Sonari, Demow, Moran, Nazira, Gaurisagar. The project location (at Lepetkata) is around 60 km from Sibsaagar town.

Jorhat District is one of the 27 Districts of the state of Assam. Jorhat town is District headquarters. Earlier, Jorhat was a sub-division in the undivided Sibsaagar District. In 1983, Jorhat was carved out of Sibsaagar District. At present Jorhat District consists of 3 sub-divisions namely Jorhat, Majuli and Titabor. The District is divided into 6 revenue circles, 8 development blocks and 111 gram panchayats. The area of the District is 2852 sq. km. with a population of 999221 (as per 2001 Census), which is around 3.75 percent of the state population, with a Population density of 350 per sq. km. The project location (at Lepetkata) is about 120 km from Jorhat town.

Changlang District is located in the hilly areas of Arunachal Pradesh with altitudes ranging from 200 m to 4500 m above mean sea level. The District is bound in the east & south by Myanmar (international borders), in the north by Tinsukia District of Assam & Lohit District of Arunachal Pradesh and in the west by Tirap District of Arunachal Pradesh. The District is home to a number of tribes such as the Tangsa, Singpho and Tutsa. The total area of the district is 4662 sq. km. The Changlang District is administered through four subdivisions namely Changlang, Miao, Jairampur and Bordumsa which can be further subdivided into 13 administrative circles; with headquarters located at Changlang town. The project location (at Lepetkata) is around 150 km from Changlang town.

Mokokchung District is located in the hilly ranges of Nagaland altitudes, bound in the east by Mon District of Nagaland, in the north & north west by the State of Assam, in the south by Tuensang and Zunheboto Districts and in the south west by the Wokha District. The District is home to the Ao Naga Tribe and is known to be the cultural centre of Nagaland. The Mokokchung District is about 120 km from Jorhat in Assam and requires an Inner Line Permit for entry. The total area of the district is 1615 sq. km. The Mokokchung District is administered through 6 blocks, 8 circles and 105 village panchayats. The District has only one urban town - Mokokchung. The project location (at Lepetkata) is around 225 km from Mokokchung town.

Baseline data corresponding to the socio-economic indicators for the PIA is summarized in the following Table.

Alongwith the above it is required that the environmental indicators are also monitored for the region which include surface water, ground water, air quality and noise.

E.5 Rehabilitation of displaced families

The consultant team had interactions with the Additional District Commissioner at Dibrugarh which provided considerable insight into the Government's perspective of the rehabilitation process and its current status in and around the project site at Lepetkata. According to the District Government records, there were a total of 66 homeless and landless families; of which there were 44 Tea estate workers, 20 Tribal families and 2 families belonging to the General category.

Under the rehabilitation package, 1 Bigha of land has been given to each family, as well as a compensatory amount of Rs. 1.5 Lakh per household has been provided for construction of new houses. Tubewells for drinking water and latrines to each household have been provided by the Public Health Engineering Department. Government has also taken care of the connecting roads and the power supply to the newly constructed homes; as well as Schools, Temples and Market places. In some cases, the compensation due for land are being settled by the Government.

E.7 Monitoring and Evaluation Framework

The selective indicators that will have an impact due to investment in the Assam Gas Cracker and downstream units within the four broad categories have been identified. It was ensured that the indicators identified not only have an impact due to the investment but also the data are available from publicly available published sources or can be collected easily from district or state departments. These helped in identification of the monitoring indicators as well as established baseline value for the same. Based on this the monitoring framework has been prepared, which lists the following:

- Various indicators under the four broad categories
- Base year for the baseline values
- Baseline Value with relevant Unit of measurement
- Data Source
- Period of monitoring
- Impact – positive or negative

The structure of the monitoring framework for the identified indicators under the four broad categories is given in Tables 5.1, 5.2 and 5.3.

E.8 Monitoring and Evaluation Cell

It is recommended that a dedicated ‘**Monitoring and Evaluation Cell**’ should be established for studying the impact of Assam Gas Cracker on North Eastern States.

- The Cell should be constituted as a part of the Chief Minister of Assam’s Secretariat, and the Chief Minister should be the Chairman of the Cell.
- The Deputy Chairman should be the Industries Minister
- The Principal Secretary / Commissioner, Industries & Commerce, Government of Assam should be the Executive Head of this Cell, and the Cell should comprise of:
 - A representative Ministry of DoNER/NEC
 - One senior executive from BCPL, OIL and NRL
 - One senior representative from the Directorate of Economics & Statistics, Government of Assam
- The Monitoring and Evaluation Cell should appoint a Consultant to collect and collate the data in the attached format and present the same to the Cell on an annual basis.
- We recommend that the monitoring should be carried out for a period of 10 years. The frequency of data update would vary for different indicators, and should be as per the frequency indicated in the attached format.
- The Consultant should commence work after the close of financial year and when the new set of data is available, preferably during September-October of each year.
- Ideally, but subject to satisfactory performance, the same consultant should perform the assignment on an ongoing basis for a minimum period of 3 years.

The scope of work of the “Cell” should include (but not limited to):

- Collection of data corresponding to identified socio-economic and industry-specific indicators from various sources and departments.
- Preparation and maintenance of a comprehensive database.
- Periodic monitoring and evaluation and reporting (maintain MIS).
- Publication of reports demonstrating success stories.
